transitory	lasting for only a short while.
translucent	permitting light to pass through, but not transparent.
ambience	environment; the surrounding atmosphere.
obituary	notice of a death with biographical information.
transient	(adj) passing quickly; transitory; (n) a person or thing having a short stay.
aberration	a straying from what is normal or accepted.
erratic	irregular or inconsistent in movement, habit, quality, or ideas.
episode	an incident in a person's life or in a story or play.
exodus	mass departure or emigration.

transition	the process or a period of changing from one state or condition to another
transmutation	the action of changing or the state of being changed into another form
exeunt	used as a stage direction in a printed play to indicate that a group of characters leave the stage
extradite	to hand over (a person accused or convicted of a crime) to the jurisdiction of the foreign state in which the crime was committed
errant	straying from the proper course or standards
errata	term for the mistakes in printing or writing
odometer	an instrument for measuring the distance traveled by a vehicle
synod	an assembly of the clergy in a diocese or other division of a particular church
